Rangia College is one of the premier institutions of higher education on the North bank of the river Brahmaputra, Assam. Rangia College has been playing a vital role in the history of Higher Education in the Northern part of Kamrup. Since the date of establishment (5th August, 1963), the College is contributing Higher Education in the field of imparting knowledge to the students. In course of time, the College is riding on the lift of improvement. At the time of establishment, the College had only one stream (Arts Stream), and, now, it is a full fledged College of three Stream (Arts, Science and Commerce).

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE DEPARTMENT:

After 10 years of establishment, the Rangia College authority felt the necessity to introduce Sanskrit and as a result, the College added Sanskrit in the list of other subjects. Thus, in 1973, the Department of Sanskrit came into existence in the history of Rangia College. After four years, having found the need and demand of the subject in 1977-78, the Degree Course was opened and began to teach Sanskrit to students. Changing time, having seen the demand of students and Guardians, again knocked at the door of Sanskrit Department to introduce Sanskrit as Major Subject. Having heard the knock of changing time, the then Head of the Department Daksheswar Deka proposed the matter to the then Principal Dr. Nila Kanta Mahanta. Being on the top of administration, the honourable Principal, a man of good personality took initiative to introduce Major in Sanskrit without any hesitation. It was 1991, in the history of Rangia College, the Sanskrit took one place in the line of Major Subjects. And finally, M.A. course is also introduced at this department in the present year, 2022.

In the growing development of Sanskrit Department, the Department itself experienced the adept hand of some broad minded innovative dedicated persons. Amongst them, the founder head of the Department was Niranjan Talukdar, who passed away in 1980. Then, Dr. Malini Goswami worked at this department and now she has retired from Department of Assamese at Gauhati University as a Professor. Dr Srutidahara Chakravorty, presently working as a Professor in the Department of Sanskrit of Gauhati University also worked at this department. Dr Bimal Krishna Bhattacharyya, later worked as an Inspector of Schools and now a retired person, was a faculty of this department. Dr. Daksheswar Deka served as Head of the Department for long 16 years and retired as Principal in-charge of Rangia College. Now, Mrs Deepa Bhattacharyya and Dr. Bimal Das are serving as Associate Professors and Dr. Tina Sarma is working as an Assistant Professor in the Department. Mrs Deepa Bhattacharyya is the present Head of the department. And also, Miss Susmita Sarma and Dr. Dhritismita Deka are served as Contractual Faculties of the department at present.

VISION OF THE DEPARTMENT:

Sanskrit is one of the oldest known languages over thousands of years. The word “Sanskrit” means “**refined, decorated or produced in perfect form**”. Sanskrit is regarded as the ancient language of Hinduism, where it was used as a means of communication and dialogue by the Hindu celestial Gods. Therefore, it was called “**Devavānī**” (the language of gods). Ancient people believed that human speech was the gift of God. We call Sanskrit as a divine language re-produced by great sages-

संस्कृत, Europeanized as Sanskrit or linguistically the Old Indo-Aryan (OIA), belongs to the Indic group of the Indo Iranian sub-branch of the Indo-European family of languages. Sanskrit is being cultivated not only in India, but also in almost all parts of the globe as one of the vehicles of the sources of Indo-European culture and history, mythology and religion, language and literature. Sanskrit, the mother of all languages, is one of the 23 official languages

of India and known as a classical language of Indian subcontinent belongs to the Indic group of language family of Indo-European and descendents (Indo Iranian & Indo Aryan).

It is liturgical language of Hinduism, Buddhism and Jainism. Sanskrit which was once the language of munis and rishis is now attracting the modern world in such a way that experts are of the opinion that Sanskrit is the best language for use with computers. Sanskrit is scientific and systematic language. Sanskrit literature is easily richest literature in the history of mankind.

Sanskrit language is the soul of Indian subcontinent. To know ancient Indian culture , Indian history , Indian economy , Indian polity ,Indian educational system , Indian people's socio economic condition Sanskrit language is only mean because Vedas, Upanisad's, Purana's, Smritis ,Ramayana , Mahabharata etc. are written in Sanskrit where we can get a real picture of Indian subcontinent. The Indian Culture and civilization is based on Sanskrit. Sanskrit is the symbol of our seniority among the nations of globe. Any civilization in course of its progress should care for personality development. The principal purpose of Vedic and Classical Sanskrit Literature was to make man in his society more fined. Stress was laid on the fact that individual life becomes meaning full only when it works in a social structure and contributes to the well being of other individuals. This is the idea of personality development reflected in Sanskrit literature.

Keeping in mind the rich heritage of Sanskrit literature we decided to popularize it. Our motto is to popularize Sanskrit among the students and common people in general.
